In many Child Saving Institute (CSI) programs, we teach children how to feel comfortable with ambiguity, knowing that this is not easy because people of all ages feel safe and comfortable in routine. We also know that ambiguity and unknowing are an unpleasant part of life. Losing what is familiar is painful for children and families.

In 2020, children and adults struggled to adapt to a time of great unknowing. CSI's doors remained open as did all of our services to children and families. CSI staff rallied with incredible displays of creativity (writing training manuals, meeting families in driveways, dropping off gift baskets, playing hide and seek via Zoom...and more). CSI's volunteer board of directors and Guild raised funding to support the agency through a sharp drop in program revenue. Many funders provided flexibility allowing CSI to move funding to underfunded programs. Although the pandemic was stressful, it was also inspiring.

We have yet to know the full impact of the pandemic on children and families; but we can say with confidence, CSI is ready to help them through the fear, trauma and uncertainty they have experienced. We are proud of the children and families who continue to seek help in their struggle and those who continue to thrive.

We have seen great shows of resilience in 2020 and we use this inspiration to propel the agency forward into 2021. CSI served the community through the Great Depression, many tornadoes and snowstorms and now its second pandemic. We will be here to, "Respond to the cry of a child", for many years to come.

When Jane's family started at ECEC the intention was to attend temporarily. Recognizing Jane's successful transition, Jane's family has decided to remain at ECEC.

Jane's mother has shared that she is grateful she had childcare during this time, and realizes many families did not have that opportunity.
